At noon, on Monday, December 19, 1960 the Electors of the State of Maryland for President and Vice President of the United States, assembled in the State House at Annapolis.

There were present W. Earle Coby, Carl Murphy, George R. Long, Robert Kratz, Jr., George W. Della, R. Emmet Bradley, Mrs. Bess B. Lavine, Charles B. Huyett and James H. Pollock. Charles B. Huyett was elected Chairman and Mrs. Bess B. Lavine was elected Secretary.
