At noon on Monday, December 14, 1964, the Electors
of the State of Maryland for President and Vice President of
the United States, assembled in the State House, at
Annapolis.

There were present William S. Townsend, Victor
Cushwa, Jr., George L. Radcliffe, Frederick W. De Jong,
Samuel Dillon, Jr., Louis Gaertner, Richard K. Coggins,
C. Philip Nichols, Mrs. Marguerite Gulli and Francis H.
Morris. George L. Radcliffe was elected Chairman and
William S. Townsend was elected Secretary.

received from Governor J. Millard Tawes of Maryland:
