

£768.2.5. Dulany's estate was not settled until 1800. Debts paid by his administrator included £3,041.13.7 to *John Cadwalader* (1741/42–1786). LAND: 8,571 acres in Anne Arundel and Baltimore counties and 14.5 lots in Annapolis, plus 1,950 acres in Frederick County held jointly with *Daniel Dulany, Jr.* (1722–1797). After his father's death Daniel Dulany, of Walter mortgaged 6,544 acres in Anne Arundel and Baltimore counties and the "mansion house" with adjacent lots in Annapolis to Osgood Hanbury & Company to secure a debt of £9,121.13.7 sterling that Walter owed the company at the time of his death.

DUNN (DUNNE), JAMES BROWN (1751–1788). BORN: on May 9, 1751, in Kent County; eldest of seven sons. NATIVE: fifth generation. RESIDED: in Upper Langford's Bay Hundred, Kent County. FAMILY BACKGROUND. FATHER: James Dunn (1728–?), son of *Robert Dunn* (1693–1745). MOTHER: Martha Ann. STEPMOTHER: Elizabeth. HALF BROTHERS: Hezekiah (1757–?); Robert (1759–?); James (1764–?); Michael (1766–?); Daruns (1767–?); and Curtis (1769–?). HALF SISTERS: Ann (1754–?); Elizabeth (1756–?); and Rebecca (1761–?). MARRIED Elizabeth, who subsequently married Gideon Comegys. CHILDREN. SONS: James Lorain; Thomas; and James. DAUGHTERS: Martha Ann Brown; Mary Ann; Anne Elizabeth; Anne; and Rebecca. PRIVATE CAREER. EDUCATION: literate. RELIGIOUS AFFILIATION: Anglican, St. Paul's Parish, Kent County. SOCIAL STATUS AND ACTIVITIES: Gent., 1783. OCCUPATIONAL PROFILE: planter. PUBLIC CAREER. DIED: between June 6 and November 7, 1788, in Kent County. PERSONAL PROPERTY: TEV, £897.6.4 current money (including 11 slaves, 21 oz. plate, and books); FB, estate overpaid £163.10.1. LAND: probably 384 acres in Kent County.

DUNN, ROBERT (ca. 1630–1676). BORN: ca. 1630, probably in England. IMMIGRATED: in 1649 as a free adult. RESIDED: in Kent County. MARRIED Jane (Joan), stepdaughter of William Elliot. She subsequently married Anthony Workman. CHILDREN. SON: Robert (1674–1729), who married Mary, daughter of *William Harris* (ca. 1644–1712). DAUGHTERS: Susanna; Joan; Rebecca; and

Alice. PRIVATE CAREER. EDUCATION: literate. RELIGIOUS AFFILIATION: converted to Quakerism. 1658. SOCIAL STATUS AND ACTIVITIES: not called Mr. on first appearance in the records; his son became an Anglican vestryman, but held no major public office. OCCUPATIONAL PROFILE: planter. PUBLIC CAREER. LEGISLATIVE SERVICE: Lower House, Kent County, 1663–1664, 1669. LOCAL OFFICES: justice, Kent County, 1664–1673 (president, 1669–1673); keeper of weights and measures, Kent County, 1671; sheriff, Kent County, 1673–1676. WEALTH DURING LIFETIME. LAND AT FIRST ELECTION: 200 acres; 700 acres by 1669. WEALTH AT DEATH. DIED: on May 12, 1676. PERSONAL PROPERTY: TEV, 60,661 pounds of tobacco (including 1 slave, 1 servant, books, and various debts owed the estate totaling 12,197 pounds of tobacco); FB, 36,790 pounds of tobacco. LAND: 750 acres.

DUNN, ROBERT (1693–1745). BORN: in 1693 in Kent County. NATIVE: third generation. RESIDED: in St. Paul's Parish, Kent County. FAMILY BACKGROUND. FATHER: Robert Dunn (1674–1729), of Kent County; vestryman of St. Paul's Parish, Kent County; son of *Robert Dunn* (ca. 1630–1676). MOTHER: Mary (?–1709), daughter of *William Harris* (ca. 1644–1712). STEPMOTHER: Mary, widow of Robert Park (?–1708). UNCLE: *James Harris* (1682–1743). BROTHERS: William (?–1728), who married Martha, daughter of Michael Miller (1675–1738); James (1699–died young). SISTERS: Jane (1701–?); Mary. STEPSISTERS: Elizabeth Park (?–1760), who married first, in 1705 Charles Ringgold, and second, Philip Davis (?–1749); Ann Park, who married by 1711 *William Blackiston* (?–1737). MARRIED first, Ann (1698–?), daughter of Michael Miller (1675–1738) and wife Martha Wickes; granddaughter of both *Joseph Wickes* (ca. 1620–1692) and *Michael Miller* (ca. 1644–1699). MARRIED second, Martha (?–1746). CHILDREN. SONS: James (1728–?), who married first, Martha Ann, and second, Elizabeth; Darius (1731–?); and Hezekiah (1734–?). DAUGHTERS: Martha; Rebecca (1726–?), who married by 1744 Joseph Wickes. PRIVATE CAREER. EDUCATION: probably literate. RELIGIOUS AFFILIATION: Anglican, St. Paul's Church, St. Paul's Parish, Kent County. SOCIAL STATUS AND ACTIVITIES: Gent., 1745; Mr., 1747. OCCUPATIONAL PROFILE: probably a planter. PUBLIC CAREER. LEGISLATIVE SERVICE: Lower House, Kent County, 1722–1724.
