

County. **FAMILY BACKGROUND.** FATHER: *Henry Holland Hawkins* (1683–1751), son of *Henry Hawkins* (?–1699). MOTHER: Jane, daughter of *Thomas Greenfield* (ca. 1649–1715). UNCLE: *Thomas Truman Greenfield* (1682–1733). BROTHERS: Samuel; Henry. SISTERS: Elizabeth; Martha; Eleanor, who married *George Dent* (?–1785); Jane; Susannah; and Ruth. FIRST COUSINS: *Francis Waring* (1715–1769); *Thomas Greenfield* (ca. 1715–1774); *Marianne Greenfield*, who married *John Stoddert* (?–1767). NIECE: Anne Dent, who married *John Parnham* (ca. 1748–1813). MARRIED by 1777 Ann. CHILDREN. SONS: Thomas; Francis Waring; Henry Holland; Caleb; and Samuel. DAUGHTERS: Martha Porteus; Eleanor; and Mary Holliday, who married (first name unknown) Hanson. **PRIVATE CAREER.** EDUCATION: literate. RELIGIOUS AFFILIATION: Protestant. SOCIAL STATUS AND ACTIVITIES: Gent., by 1770. OCCUPATIONAL PROFILE: planter. **PUBLIC CAREER.** LEGISLATIVE SERVICE: Lower House, Charles County, 1771 (discharged on October 14, 1771 for “treating” at the election; reelected to session), 1773–1774 (Public Offices 1, 2, 3; Claims 2, 3); Conventions, Charles County, 1st, 1774, 2nd, 1774, 4th, 1775, 5th, 1775 (elected, but did not attend), 6th–8th, 1775–1776; Lower House, Charles County, 1783 (Claims), 1784 (elected, but did not attend). LOCAL OFFICES: justice, Charles County, 1762—at least 1777 (quorum, 1770—at least 1777); Committee of Observation, Charles County, elected 1774; justice, Orphans’ Court, Charles County, commissioned 1777, 1779, 1782, and 1783; commissioner of tax, Charles County, 1777—at least 1783; trustee, Charlotte Hall School, 1778; judge, Court of Appeals for Tax Assessment, Charles County, appointed 1786. **MILITARY SERVICE:** colonel, 1778. **WEALTH DURING LIFETIME.** PERSONAL PROPERTY: assessed value £2,018.8.4, including 40 slaves and 1 oz. plate, 1783. **LAND AT FIRST ELECTION:** 3,161 acres in Charles and Prince George’s counties (inherited 629 acres from his father in 1751, and 1,628 acres, which were his brothers’ shares of their father’s estate, by 1770). **WEALTH AT DEATH.** DIED: on October 30, 1789, in Charles County. **PERSONAL PROPERTY:** TEV, £2,104.12.8 current money (including 33 slaves and books); FB, £1,985.6.4. **LAND:** at least 2,415 acres in Charles and Prince George’s counties.

**HAWKINS, RALPH** (?–ca. 1669/70). IMMIGRATED: in 1652 as a free adult from England. RESIDED: in Broad Neck Hundred, Anne Arundel County. MARRIED first, (name unknown). MARRIED second, Margaret. CHILDREN. SONS: William;

Ralph. **PRIVATE CAREER.** EDUCATION: literate. RELIGIOUS AFFILIATION: Quaker. SOCIAL STATUS AND ACTIVITIES: no title on arrival; no record of any office besides burgess. OCCUPATIONAL PROFILE: planter; merchant. **PUBLIC CAREER.** LEGISLATIVE SERVICE: Lower House, Anne Arundel County, 1662. **WEALTH AT DEATH.** DIED: after September 19, 1669; will probated on January 4, 1669/70. **PERSONAL PROPERTY:** TEV, 26,780 pounds of tobacco (including 1 servant). **LAND:** probably 350 acres.

**HAWLEY, JEROME** (1590–1638). BORN: in 1590 in Middlesex, England; younger son. IMMIGRATED: in 1633 as a free adult with his wife and family. RESIDED: in St. Mary’s County; moved to Virginia, 1637/38. **FAMILY BACKGROUND.** FATHER: James Hawley (1558–1622), of Brentford, Middlesex, England. MOTHER: Susann, daughter of Robert Tuthill, of Amersham, England. BROTHERS: William Hawley, Esq., of Grossmont, Monmouth, England; James Hawley, Esq. (?–by 1667), of New Brandford, Middlesex, England; Henry (?–1679), governor of Barbados; and Gabriel (1609–by 1636/37). MARRIED first, (first name unknown) Hawkins. MARRIED second, Eleanor, widow of Thomas Courtney. CHILDREN. STEPSON: Sir William Courtney, of Newhouse, Wiltshire, England. **PRIVATE CAREER.** EDUCATION: literate. RELIGIOUS AFFILIATION: Catholic. SOCIAL STATUS AND ACTIVITIES: his family was very active in colonizing both Virginia and Barbados; he was a one-eighth partner in the *Ark*, 1633; returned to England in 1635–1637, where he successfully lobbied for high appointments in Virginia; coauthored with *John Lewger* (1602–1665), *A Relation of Maryland*, 1635; “gentleman server” to Queen Henrietta Maria, 1637. OCCUPATIONAL PROFILE: colonial investor; merchant; placeman. **PUBLIC CAREER.** LEGISLATIVE SERVICE: Assembly, 1637/38. OTHER PROVINCIAL OFFICES: commissioner, 1633–1637; Council, 1637–1638. OUT OF COLONY SERVICE: councilor and treasurer of Virginia, 1636/37–1638. STANDS ON PUBLIC/PRIVATE ISSUES: accused of weakly defending Lord Baltimore’s claims to Kent Island and of being excessively avaricious, 1638. **WEALTH AT DEATH.** DIED: prior to August 2, 1638. **PERSONAL PROPERTY:** TEV, £944.13.0 sterling; most of his estate went to satisfy his creditors. **LAND:** rights to 6,000 acres.

**HAY (KEY, HEY), JAMES** (?–by 1717/18). BORN: of age by 1699. NATIVE: origins uncertain, but definitely in Maryland by 1699; possibly second generation. RESIDED: in St. Mary’s County.
