PREFACE

This work, actually a part of a larger study that is being undertaken to present in catalog form a record of the works that have come from Maryland presses, covers the period from 1819 through 1822. The groundwork for the larger study was laid by the American Imprints Inventory which was carried forward under the Works Progress Administration. Without this comprehensive and valuable contribution, the present effort would not have been possible.

During the course of this imprints study many institutions and persons have been most helpful. I am deeply indebted to the members of the staff of the Union Catalog of the Library of Congress for their generous assistance and unselfish co-operation. I am especially grateful to Mr. Charles LaHood of that staff for his patience and assistance. At the Maryland Historical Society, Mr. Fred Shelley, the librarian, placed at my disposal the facilities of his institution as well as his extensive knowledge of Maryland materials, and I am under deep obligation to him. Of great assistance, also, were the members of the staff of the Maryland Room of the Emoch Fratt Free Library of Baltimore and of the Peabody Institute Library. Finally, I should like to make grateful acknowledgment to the Reverend J. J. Kortendick, S.S., who first suggested the problem, to Mr. M. W. Getchell, who guided the study to its present completion, and to the entire faculty of the Department of Library Science of Catholic University for their wise counsel and generous assistance.

INTRODUCTION

Through the efforts of the workers on the American Imprints Inventory, a voritable mine of raw information has been made available regarding printing and printers in America. It remained necessary, however, to organize, analyze, and edit the material in such a manner that would make it possible for librarians and scholars to use it. Since no one individual could carry the work through to a successful conclusion, it has been deemed advisable to divide the work among a large number. This small segment deals with the imprints of Maryland between 1819 and 1822.

This bibliography of imprints includes all of the reported titles and locations as found in the Union Catalog of the Library of Congress, the Library of the Maryland Historical Society, the Maryland Room of the Emoch Pratt Free Library, and the Peabody Institute of Baltimore. While it was not possible to verify all titles and information with absolute preciseness, a real effort to do so has been made with considerable success.

The brief history of Maryland following the War of 1812 has been presented for the purpose of providing the political, social, and economic background against which printing developed during the period. This provides an understanding, it seems, of many things regarding Maryland imprints, including the importance of Catholic printers, the place of German and other immigrants in this phase of the State's cultural life, and the almost complete domination of the printing business by the men of Baltimore. An accompanying map of Maryland shows the location of the printers in the State.

The bibliography of Maryland Imprints, 1819-1822, comprises the main portion of this work and contains more than one thousand entries. The general arrangement of the bibliography is chronological. Within each year the entries are alphabetically arranged by author or, where there is no author, by title. In

the listings the rules of entry of the Library of Congress have been followed. In view of the fact that many of the items are relatively rare, the institutions where the items are available are listed in the entry. In the few cases where the item is to be found in more than twenty libraries, only twenty such locations were listed. The key to libraries where imprints are located is the same that is used by the Union Catalog of the Library of Congress. To facilitate the understanding and use of Maryland imprints during the period several lists and tables have been prepared, including a subject-matter table, a list of newspapers and other periodicals, a list of printers and publishers, and an author and title index to the bibliography.

CHAPTER I

MARYLAND. 1819-1822

In the years following the War of 1812 Maryland emerged, slowly at first, from the horrors of first-hand experience with the grave realities of war. The speaker in the Britich House of Commons, who accused the people of Maryland of being the "great depository of the hostile spirit of the United States against England," apparently sensed the political and economic importance of Maryland in the effort to subdue the United States. One can be certain that the British armed forces that made such a desperate, but unsuccessful attempt to capture Ft. McHenry in 1814, appreciated the importance of Maryland's Bay area to the grand strategy of bringing the United States to its knees. It was all over by 1815, and Marylanders in general and Baltimoreans in particular could breathe more freely. The Treaty of Ghent had brought peace, but not surcease from the task of building a great state in the new republic of the West.

The war's aftermath in Maryland was deeply affected by two incidents of the war itself, both of which strengthened Maryland's faith in herself and in the nation. One was, of course, the repulse of the British at Ft. McHenry. The other was the composition of "The Star Spangled Banner" by a young lawyer of Frederick Town, Francis Scott Key. On the lips of everyone was praise for the brave men at Ft. McHenry; on the lips of everyone was "Oh Say Can You See!" Both were vital forces in strengthening the national consciousness and in giving Marylanders the feeling of taking part in the building of a greater America.

For the nation as a whole it was the "Era of Good Feeling," whom party strife was at a minimum and when another of Jefferson's proteges, James Monroe, administered the affairs of the country with skill and grace. It was a period of steady expansion, and the people of the East were filling in the Mississippi Valley to the point that territories were rapidly qualifying for statehood. Only the do-

But in Maryland, the period could hardly be described as an era of good feeling.

In the second decade of the nineteenth century the Federalists had dominated the political picture of Maryland, despite the control of the national government by the Republicans, soon to be called Democrats. In 1819, however, after one of the most exciting contests ever held in the state, the Democrats succeeded in gaining control of the General Assembly and in electing a Democrat, Samuel Sprigg, to the office of governor.

The Democrats, seeking to liberalize political practices, if not merely to entrench themselves, introduced a number of reforms. One was a proposal to amend the Constitution to transfer the power of electing the governor from the legislature to the populace. The Federalists were alarmed. They said that Baltimore, with more than 62,000 people, one-third of whom were first-generation foreigners, would control every gubernatorial election. The bill was defeated throughout this period, and not until 1838 was the Constitution amended to provide for the election of the governor by the people. 4 Another proposal, introduced by Thomas Kell of Baltimore, was to give the city of Baltimore two additional representatives in the General Assembly, thus bringing the city's representation to a total of four. The argument was that the growing metropolis had no more representation than rural counties with less than half its population. The legislature, moreover, gave too much of its attention to the effairs of Baltimore which could be remedied by giving the city more representation. People in other parts of the state were alarmed and openly asserted that the "Baltimore Jacobins," were up to nothing good. Although the bill passed the House of Delegates, it was defeated in the Senate in 1819 and 1820.5

The third matter that concerned the politicians of Maryland was the question of the legal disability of the Jews, who had been excluded by the Constitution of 1776 from holding civil or military office. Those citizens who were heally sensitive to the tradition of religious and political freeder in the state under-

took to remove this disability. Among them were Thomas Kennedy, H. M. Bracken-bridge, General William H. Windor, and others. Kennedy introduced a bill that came to be known as the "Jow Bill," which would give the prescribed group complete political equality. He argued that the Maryland Declaration of Rights and Article V and the First Amendment of the Federal Constitution supported his position. The debates on the bill were bitter in 1819 and 1820. Kennedy lost his seat in 1821, largely because of his stand on this question, but the bill passed both houses in 1822. In view of the fact that the bill had to be approved by a subsequent legislature, it was not finally ratified until 1825. Thus, the 150 Jews of the state were finally given full citizenship.

Almost from the beginning, the economic life of Maryland was conditioned by the presence of Megro slaves. From a mere handful in the middle of the seventeenth century the slave population had increased to the point that it had reached more than 107,000 by 1820. 10 On this foundation of forced labor a plantation economy had sprung up that looked to tabacco and other staples as the cornerstone of the state's economic life. It was, indeed, an agricultural economy that prodominated, but it was an idle dream to believe that tobacco plantation slavery was the cornerstone of the state's economic strength. Grain growing was gaining in popularity as an economic pursuit. Commerce and manufacturing, however, were occupying increasingly important places in the economic life of state. For example, more than 500,000 barrels of flour were milled in the vicinity of Baltimore in 1822, and that city was becoming an important market for coal, lumber, cotton textiles, brewery products, and fish, as well as a variety of grain products. 11

Maryland seemed to appreciate its future importance in agriculture, nanufacturing, and commerce. It was determined to keep up with the feverish movement on the part of other states to expand their sphere of influence after the War of 1812. It sought to build roads, canals, and ships in order to preserve its position of economic importance and, if possible, to enhance it. In 1818, for example, the legislature authorized companies to build roads from Bechaborough to Williams.

port and from Williamsport to Rockville. 12 This was a kind of complement to the National Road that was being constructed from Baltimore to Wheeling in the western part of Virginia. 13 Meanwhile the legislature authorised the construction of canals on the Severn and Potomac Rivers by the Patapsco Canal Companies. 14 Although the canals were not constructed during this period, these and other explorations into the field of internal improvements indicate the energy and industry of Marylanders in building a strong economic order during the early nineteenth century.

Maryland, like the other states in the United States, extended itself far beyond its powers in the period after the War of 1812. Thanks to the lending powers of the Bank of the United States and of local banks, there seemed to be no limit to expansion. It soon became clear that there had been excessive and unwise expansion especially in internal improvements, in manufacturing and in shipbuilding. With the inevitable contraction, the Maryland branch of the Bank of the United States at Baltimore began to have trouble, as well as the principal local financial institution, the City Bank of Baltimore, which was forced to close. The panic of 1819 was upon the state, and the price of main staples, flour and tobacco, fell to ruinous levels. One business after another failed in Baltimore, Frederick, and Amapolis. Men welked the streets looking for work; and soup kitchens, among the first in the United States, became commonplace in Baltimore. 15

The state was not daunted by these economic hardships, and in the face of a dark and uncertain future it undertook to lay the foundation for an even greater expanded economy. It continued to put money into internal improvements. In 1819 the state planned to spend almost \$500,000 to build a road between Conceedneague and Hagerstown to connect with the National Road at Cumberland. In the following year a group of enterprising businessmen organized the Boonsboro Turnpike Company. 16 Others, sensing the growing importance of steamboats, invested a great deal of capital in the shipbuilding industry and were responsible for Bultimore remaining an important connercial center in the nineteenth century. Seen the state was again prosperous. It must be added, however, that the more discerning leaders of the

state began to wonder, as they witnessed the emergence of a diversified economy, if Negro slavery was the proper basis for such an economic order. 17

Even if there was some question regarding the economic future of slavery, the institution was universally acknowledged to be a prime factor in the social life of the state. In 1820 there were 280,222 whites, 107,393 slaves, and 39,730 free Negroes. 18 The relationship of these groups to each other was based exclusively on race, and quite frequently, even within a group, race was an important conditioning factor in the relationship. To area of life escaped the factor of race. It affected taxes, education, religion, and politics. Each attention of the white population was devoted to the problems of social control presented by the Negro's presence. And although Marylanders, perhaps more than any other slaveholders in 1819 entertained serious doubte about slavery, they could not bring themselves to give it up. In 1819, for example, when a Pennsylvania minister invested against slavery at a Maryland camp mosting, he was indicted by the Grand Jury of Washington County for inciting slaves to insurrection. Only the elequent defense of Roger B.

they showed more enlightenment in connection with other social problems. Toward the end of the administration of Governor Charles Coldsborough in 1819, the legis-lature repealed the law favoring imprisonment for debt. In the following year several laws were passed that were designed to protect immigrants from exploitation by any person who brought foreigners into the state. One law, for example, required the registering of approntices who had agreed to work to repay their passage.

Registration would make it impossible for unscrupulous employers to make illegal demands of their charges. On this law the people of Maryland showed an appreciation for the heterogeneity of their copulation that had been characteristic of the state from its carliest days. Germans, Permsylvania Dutch, Irish, and even Huguenots had steadily augmented the state's population that had been predominantly English and African in its origins. 21

While provisions were being rade for the protection of European immigrants, some Marylanders busied themselves with plans to deport the free Negroes. Among the most enthusiastic supporters of the American Colonization Society in its formative stages were several men from Maryland. Three of the original group of vice-presidents in 1817 were from Maryland, John E. Howard, Samuel Smith, and John C. Herbert; while Francis Scott Key was on the Board of Managers. By 1819 an auxiliary society was flourishing in Baltimore and Key and others had succeeded in raising more than \$5,000 in the state for the support of the work. Although there was to be much greater success in later years, the movement had succeeded, by 1822, in persuading thirty-six Maryland Megroes to cast their lot with what came to be known as "Maryland in Liberia."

Despite the proscription of Jews in Maryland, the state was generally regarded, and with some justification, as a place of religious telerance. Its Roman Catholic erientation that stemmed from the religion of the founding family, the Calverts, never served as an obstacle to the entrance into the state of persons of other religious beliefs. Coming up into the Eastern Shore from Virginia were various protestant sects, of which the Episcopalians were the largest group. 23 Pushing down from Pennsylvania and coming over from Europe was a German element that was largely Lutheren and Dutch Reformed in its religious affiliations. 24 Coming into the state from Ireland, was a considerable group that augmented the large Catholic element already there. In addition there were the Baptists and Methodists who were steadily increasing in numbers in the first quarter of the ninetcenth century. The religious picture in Maryland was one of cosmopolitanism by 1819.

One of the very significant religious events was the coming of Jared Sparks, distinguished scholar and preacher, to the pastorate of the First Independent Unitarian Church in Baltimore in 1819. The Unitarian denomination was gaining favor among certain intellectual elements in the northeast that had formerly been attached to the Congregational Church, and in 1817 a group of Unitarians organized a church in Baltimore. 25 When Sparks was ordained on May 5, 1819, William Ellowy

Channing of Boston preached the sermon. It was the clearest statement of the Unitarian faith that had yet been made, and almost immediately Unitarianism became one of the most controversial religious topics in the state. 26

There can be little doubt that the most exciting religious event of the period was the consecration of the Roman Catholic Cathedrel on May 51, 1821. It was designed in Byzantine style by J. H. B. Latrove, the architect of the capital in Washington, and the cornerstone of this great edifice had been laid in 1805. Although the Cathedral was not quite completed, Archbishop Ambrose Marechal felt that the time had come for its dedication. Visiting church dignitaries from all over the country, including the Bishops of Philadelphia and Boston, were present for the impressive coremonies. Even before nine o'clock, the hour for the beginning, the building was filled, and great throngs waited outside to witness the colorful procession. This event added to the already tremendous prestige of the Catholic Church in Maryland.²⁷

Back in the middle of the eighteenth century the colonial logislature sought to encourage education by placing responsibility on the several counties to support education through donations to private institutions. This is how the Frederick County school got its start in 1763. It was not until 1816, however, that the counties began to lovy taxes on turnpikes and corporations for school purposes. With donations and taxes for support, several schools were organized between 1819 and 1822. Among them were the Franklin Academy in 1820, the St. James Academy and the Lower Marlboro Academy in 1821, and the Baltimore County school in 1822. The wide variety of subjects taught and the notheds used can be seen by observing that in 1921 Joseph Lencaster set up an institute in Baltimore in which one person could teach needlework to three hundred pupils at the same time. 29

While Maryland lagged behind some of her northern neighbors in the field of higher education, the state was far ahead of most of the southern states. The first college to survive for any length of time was Washington College at Gaster-

town, on the Fastern Shore. Beginning as a school in the colonial period, it was raised to the level of a college by the Rev. William Smith in 1782. In 1812 the General Assembly voted an annual donation of \$800, and between 1819 and 1822 it flourished. At Annapolis St. John's College was founded in 1785. The state gave it an annual sum of \$1,000; and in 1821 it permitted the institution to raise \$80,000 by lottery. Between 1820 and 1824 the principal was the Rev. Henry Lyon Davis. The second attempt to set up a University of Maryland was made in 1812. The state did little to support the institution except to authorize a lottery in its behalf. It was having troubles of various kinds under Provest James Kemp in 1822.

It was only natural to expect the religious groups would manifest a deep interest in education. The Methodists founded Asbury College in 1816 at Baltimore. Under the Rev. Samuel K. Jennings it had more than 180 students in various courses, including medicine, in 1819. 31

The Roman Catholic Church undertook a full program of education for its communicants and for others. Farochial schools were to be found throughout the state. Perhaps the outstanding one was the Malo Free School of St. Peter's Church in Baltimore, which was begun in 1817 under the leadership of Archbishop Marechal. There was, moreover, Mount St. Mary's College at Emmitsburg, founded in 1808 by Father John Dubois. In 1820 it was a flourishing institution with elaborate plans for expansion. The first Roman Catholic seminary in the United States, the Seminary of St. Sulpice, was founded in Baltimore in 1791. This institution, popularly known as St. Mary's, did not prosper in the beginning. Soon it showed signs of growth. By 1800 it had more than one hundred pupils, and by 1819, under the leadership of Father Edward Damphoux, it was gaining an important place in the educational life of the nation. 34

Under the impetus of religion and education the cultural and intellectual life of the state was greatly improved. The interest in art and architecture was manifested in various ways, by the enthusiasm over the new cathedral in Baltimore

and by the excitement over the new courthouse in Annapolis. During the period the monument celebrating the repulse of the British was completed, and a lettery made possible the completion of the magnificent Washington Monument on Howard's Hill. This latter structure gave rise to the designation of the city as "The Monumental City." SS

Groups of citizens came together and organized cultural and literary societies. There was the society of laymen of the Episcopal Church in Annapolis that met regularly, at which time its members exchanged views on literary mattere. 37 There were the distinguished Baltimoreans who organized the Dolphian Club in which they engaged in musical, literary, and artistic activities. Among them were John P. Kennedy, William Wirt, the younger J. H. B. Latrobe, and Francis Scott Key. 30 Another group organized, in 1822, the Maryland Academy of Science and Literature. They collected minerals and zoological specimens and later set up a herbarium. Soon there were brenches of the academy in various parts of the state. 39

One can say that the period between 1819 and 1822 was one of considerable activity in almost every phase of life in Maryland. With so much activity in the political, economic, and social life of the state, it was only natural that there should be a great deal of attention given to the description of events, the discussion of problems, and the expression of ideas. This would involve, of course, the publishing of newspapers and journals as well as the printing of books. The people of Maryland, as we shall see, were no less active in this sphere than they were in others.

CHAPTER II

MARYLAND PRINTING 1819-1822

Approximately two hundred years after the first settlements in Maryland the people of the State could point with pride to the strides that they had made in many fields, including printing. Indeed, printing had become so important to the several communities that people wondered how they ever got along without these important adjuncts to civilization. In their first half century, Marylanders began to enjoy the services of local printers. William Nuthcad, an Englishman, in 1685, brought the first press to Laryland from Virginia, after he found it impossible to work there because the "governmental authorities in Virginia resolutely forbade printing of any kind in that dominion." Nuthead set up his press in St. Vary's City where he worked for ten years. When he died in 1695 he left his press to his wife, Dinah, but she was unable to carry on its work. Maryland's first really successful printer was William Parks, who came from Indlow, England, to Annapolis about 1726, where he remained until 1737 when he went to Williamsburg. Virginia, and set up his press. 2 Shortly thereafter, in 1739, Jonas Green, grandson of Samuel Green of Cambridge, Massachusetts, settled in Annapolis. For over a century Jonas Green and his family maintained one of the most important printing establishments in Maryland. The list of pioneoring printers lengthened as the years passed and came to include such persons as: Nicholas Hasselbach, William Goddard, John Dunlap, James Hayes, Jr., John Hayes of Baltimore, and Samuel Sower. None of their establishments was large. As a matter of fact, the printing presses themselves were small and the work was done by one or two men in the community.

Printing in Maryland made great strides in the years following the close of the War of 1812. The machinery was improved and the volume of printing greatly increased. Gradually the problems of insufficient ink, type, and paper, as well as of inadequate labor, were overcome. Between 1819 and 1822 several new names

appear, although many printers who had established themselves earlier in the century were still in tusiness. The variety of printer material increased enormously Almanacs, for example, were increasing in popularity. The work of the General Assembly increased, and this called for an increase in the variety and volume of official documents. Buropean materials, such as medical works and hymnals were being reprinted in Maryland, while sermons, poetry, music of local authors and composers were coming from Maryland's presses. With the growth of towns and the increase in educational activity, printing in Maryland began to come into its own. Cradually printing became a fairly important vocation for masters and apprentices.

The smaller towns beasted of printing establishments almost as early as the settlers had governments. Hagerstown's population did not reach 3,371 until 1850, but as early as 1790, this predominantly German settlement had a printer in the person of Stewart Herbert, whose newspaper, The Washington Spy, flourished until his death in 1795. About this time Semuel Gruber started printing a series of almanaes in German as well as a newspaper Die Westliche Correspondenz. By the time of his death at the age of 90, late in 1857, he had seen the German people accept English as their language. Consequently his paper and almanaes shifted to the adopted tongue of his readers.

In 1820 Frederick was a bustling little town of 3,640 people. Matthias

Bartgis had, by this time, been the leading printer of the community for almost

twenty years. Not only did he publish a newspaper, variously called The Frederick

Advertiser and Bartgis' Federal Gazette but he printed most of the material that

came out of Frederick during 1819 and 1920. Upon his death in the latter year,

his two sons carried on the tradition of their father. The Bartgis' establishment

did not enjoy a monopoly of the trade in Frederick. Other printers, with smaller

resources but with some patronage, included David Hartin, G. W. Sharp, John P.

Thompson, and G. Kolb.

Although Easton was a tiny village on the Eastern Shore, it had a printer to serve the predominantly rural population of Talbet County, which numbered

14,389 in 1820. He was Jemes Cowen, who founded the Easten Maryland Herald and
Eastern Shore Intelligencer in 1790. For more than thirty years Cowan was the principal printer for the people of that section of the State.

There were only 2,260 people in Annapolis in 1820, 6 but the printers of that town were in an especially adventageous position, for this was the capital of the State where the General Assembly convened annually. The printing demands of the State officials were numerous and business was good. Acts, bills, potitions, laws, proclamations, and the like had to be printed and they usually bore an Annapolis imprint. Between 1819 and 1822, for example, citizens were socking relief from the tell charges of the newly built turnpike roads; they wanted a report of the investigation of the Potomac River; they requested land for school buildings; and, of course, they wanted reports on the laws and votes of their representatives. There was enough business for several printers. The State printer between 1819 and 1822 seemed to have been Jonas Green, whose family had been printing in the State since 1739, but the name of John Chandler is also on many of the official documents of the State. Jeremiah Hughes, who did not go into business until 1822, seemed to prosper during that first year. The fact that he published the Maryland Republican doubtless strengthened his position in the community. 7

Perhaps the proximity of Rockvillo to Vashington accounts for the presence of two printers there by 1822. In 1820 the community's population was not even listed in the decennial census, but it had 6,435 by 1850. In 1822 two printers were at work there. One was J. B. Calvin, who was undertaking to edit the speeches of the Presidents of the United States. The other was J. A. Bingham, whose inprints seen to indicate his interest in religious materials.

The city of Baltimore, of course, had the greatest concentration of publishers and printers in the State. The multiplicity of business, civic, educational, and religious activities called for a great deal of printing. Thus the Ealtimore imprint was to be found on books, sermons, Bibles, prayer books, plays, and broadsides, as well as on numerous business forms. Indeed, printing in Baltical

more ran the whole genut, from materials on the yellow fever during the epidemic of 1819 to books for "good little boys and girls" with charming woodcuts that made them suitable for Christmas gifts. Several Baltimore firms, moreover, did printing for Washington officials and businesses. For example, Benjamin Edes, one of the leading Baltimore printers, brought out the remarks that John Quincy Adams, the Secretary of State, made on the Fourth of July 1821. It is well known that Hezekiah Niles kept his eye on Washington more than on Baltimore.

It was in Baltimore that one finds some substantial distinction between publishers and printers. Fielding Lucas, Jr., publisher, employed J. D. Toy, Benjamin Edes, and R. J. Natchett to print books for him. So did J. Robinson. The picture becomes somewhat confused, however, when one discovers that Robinson was also printing books and other material himself.

Fielding Lucas was perhaps the outstanding Maryland publisher of the period. Born in Fredericksburg, Virginia, in 1781, he gained his training and experience in Philadelphia. In 1806 he moved to Baltimore where he organized the firm of Conrad, Lucas and Company. Soon he became the sole proprietor of the business. He operated a type foundry from which he made a fortune, and of which a catalog is extant, but during his long career \(\frac{1806-18547}{1806-18547} \) he never printed any of his own books. Through his Philadelphia connections he was able to secure supplies. At his bookstore on Market Street he had a large inventory of American and foreign books. An Episcopalian himself, Lucas married a member of the Catholic Church, Elizabeth Carrell. For many years he held a paw in the great Baltimore Cathodral; and he published many works by Catholic authors. As he lay dying, Lucas was received into the Church and was buried from the Cathodral.

Another very outstanding publisher and printer of Baltimore was Joseph Robinson, whose name appears on numerous printed works between 1819 and 1822. His special interest seemed to be in materials bearing on civic and national affairs. He maintained a circulating library on Ealtimore Street and published the popular Robinson's Magazine.

Hezekiah Niles, easily the best known Karyland printer, began early in 1811 to work on his prospects for the Weekly Register, which brought him national recognition. Niles had received his training in Philadelphia while serving his appronticeship under Benjamin Johnson, a printer, bookbinder, and bookseller. It wiles is an excellent example of one man who was both printer and editor. He obtained most of his information for his paper from other newspapers. He carefully wrote the editorials and often the leading articles, edited and corrected the copy, and tried in every way to keep the Register up to his own high standards. 12

Niles was keenly aware of local and national problems and sought through his publication to advise his readers without taking sides. As he advanced in age, William Ogden Niles, one of his twenty children, took over the Register as editor and publisher in 1836.

Newspapers played an important role in most of the towns of Maryland.

They were, of course, the principal sources of current information and news of the day. National and local issues were carried to the people and gave the fireside generals food for discussion. Circulation was considered good considering the wide dispersion of the population. Most of the newspapers were printed weekly and were fiercely partisan in their politics, as some of the titles suggest.

Hagerstown had one local paper, The Washington Spy, a weekly that was begun in 1790 by Stewart Herbert. Amnapolis boasted of The Maryland Cazette and The Maryland Republican. The Gazette began in January 1745 and was discontinued in 1839 with the death of Jonas Green. The Republican started in 1809 and lived a few years after 1820.

There were several newspapers in Frederick County. In 1820 George Kolb and William Dougherty were printing The Family Cazette. At the same time George F. Steyman and Rev. S. W. Harkey were issuing The Family Visitor. Charles Sower began the Star of Federalism which remained in emistence from 1815 to 1821. The Republican Gazette, also known as the Maryland Cazette, appeared under various titles from 1786 as Matthias Bartgis, printer and editor, sought to serve Western

Maryland with his publication. Eartgis sold to Robert Ritchie and John Hacgill in 1820. John P. Thompson issued the Herald from 1802 to 1861, but it did not soom to prosper. At Westminster The Republican Citizen was published by George W. Sharp who later moved to Frederick and brought the paper with him. Another Frederick paper was The Examiner which Samuel Barnes printed from 1813 to 1833.13

There was a long and distinguished history of newspaper publishing in Baltimore by 1819. There were, of course, more newspapers in Baltimore than in any other Maryland town. It must be added, however, that many newspapers that began with good prospects for success did not last very long. William Goddard's Maryland Journal and Baltimore Advertiser that began in 1773 had expired by 1797. William Dunlpa began to publish his Maryland's Cazette in 1775 but went out of business in 1795. Others were more successful, including the Baltimore Daily Repository that was started by David Graham in 1791 and continued to flourish during the period under observation. This first daily paper in the city became the Federal Intelligencer and Baltimore Advertiser in 1794. The well-known Baltimore printer, William Cwynn, was its proprietor between 1812 and 1834. The other daily newspaper was the Baltimore American and Daily Advertiser that was begun in 1799 by Alexander Martin and was published by Pechin, Dobbin, Murphy and Bose from 1815 to 1832. 14

Niles Weekly Register was the best known and most widely read newspaper in Baltimore. From the time of its founding in 1811 it flourished, under the shrewd management of Hezekiah Niles. It contained, "political, statistical, historical, economical, geographical and scientifical, biographical documents, essays, and facts; together with notices of the arts and manufacturers and a record of the events of the times. 15 It was more of a national journal than a local one.

There were other newspapers in Baltimore, including the Sunday Messenger begun by Ebenezer French in 1819; The Federal Republican and Commercial Advertiser published between 1819 and 1822 by Benjamin Edes and James P. Heath; The Baltimore Patriot and Evening Advertiser published from 1812 through the 1850's

by Ebenezer French and Isaac Monroe; and the Morning Chronicle, edited by Paul Allen between 1819 and 1822.

There were several magazines and other periodicals some of which were published irregularly. The members of the Delphian Club, for example, got out a magazine now and then called The Red Book, which contained the poems, essays, and sketches of its members. Beginning in 1818 Joseph Robinson published Robinson's Repository, a collection of original papers as well as reprints from leading English magazines. Of great interest to the rural population was J. S. Skinner's The American Farmer that appeared in 1819 and continued at monthly intervals until 1845. The Unitarian Biscellany and Christian Monitor was published in 1819 by the Baltimore Unitarian Book Society with Jared Sparks as editor. 17

Thus, between 1819 and 1822, the people of Maryland were favored with an active and enterprising group of printers and publishers who provided them with almost every conceivable type of reading matter. That they were selective is indicated by their willingness to go far afield to bring their readers a wide and interesting variety of works by authors from various parts of the United States and from abroad. That they approxiated the genius of the people of the State is shown by their willingness to bring out an impressive list of titles that were the products of the literary efforts of the local people. Their versatility is to be seen both in their wide range of interests and in the way many of them printed and published books, did some writing themselves, and edited newspapers and other periodicals. Indeed the printers of Maryland, between 1819 and 1822, made significant contributions to practically every phase of life in the State.
