INTRODUCTION

The fast-disappearing records of books published in the early days of the United States, have occasioned scholarly research by such agencies as the Library of Congress, the American Antiquarian Society, the American Imprints Survey, and many earnest historians. Their valuable contributions have charted a course for a national bibliography, which, though well defined, is not yet complete. The nineteenth century, in particular, offers rich opportunities for the preservation of our cultural heritage.

This check-list of Maryland imprints for 1872 and 1873 is concerned with a period which has largely been unexplored and unrecorded. In locating books of these years that are extant, the generous assistance of many libraries has been given. Their gracious cooperation has made this work possible.

The first step in ascertaining the titles of books of the "Old Line State", was to consult the files of the Library of Congress. There, results of prior investigation are kept on temporary slips, which must be verified before inclusion in the Union Catalog. These notations were copied on large cards--and the information was consolidated. Then the Union Catalog itself was checked for items which had already been made a part of it. Additional books by authors of the period were also found in this way.

Where books had been reported as being in distant States, letters of inquiry were written. The gratifying response to these

requests was an indication of the widespread interest in historical bibliography. Information, thus obtained, was entered on small cards which had been sent with the inquiries, and returned in self-addressed envelopes. Then letters of acknowledgement were written.

Libraries of the District of Columbia, Baltimore, and Philadelphia hold many of the books which were located. This necessitated personal visits to such places as the Library of Congress; the District of Columbia Public Library; U. S. Government agencies; the Maryland Historical Society; the Enoch Pratt Library; and the Library Company of Philadelphia. Where possible, individual copies were examined.

Cards again were checked, duplicates eliminated, and the location of each book in various libraries placed in symbols after the entry. For a separate section, periodicals were searched and listed. Publishers of the imprints were noted from the cards, after which background data was secured about them from references. A valuable source for information about the printers was discovered in the biography catalog card file in the Maryland Room of the Enoch Pratt Library. This alphabetized treasury of names provided clues for the location of articles about John B. Piet, T. Newton Kurtz, Louis Charles Schneiderreith and James Lucas. Then an outline map of Maryland was marked with place names.

A review of the history was next in order, followed by the writing of an introduction. An index was devised before the entire project was typed.

The majority of publishers were located in Baltimore, centering their activities in the vicinity of Baltimore and Charles Sts.

Numerically, most of the books in the check-list were printed by John Murphy and Company, cited in ¹The Book in America as "a leader in the publication of devotional books." Kelly, Piet and Company; John P. Des Forges; Innes and Company; Sherwood Brothers; Turnbull Brothers; and William K. Boyle and Son, all of Baltimore, were also prominent. In a lesser degree, publishers and printers in Woodstock, Annapolis, Hagerstown, Frederick, Powsontown (now Towson), and Carrollton contributed a share to the printing of the time.

Many of the imprints were for the printing of paper-bound pamphlets, which was then a popular method for disseminating ideas. Emphasis was upon civic and ethical questions, and little of frivolity was to be found. Governmental and educational texts far outnumbered novels, plays and song books. A great interest in social welfare was evidenced by accounts of the numerous societies which labored for the benefit of the conditions of the poor and the unfortunate.

The following distribution of the imprints by broad general subjects indicates that pure science was not the written about topic that it is today.

Three hundred and sixty-eight imprints were listed. According to references found, many more books were published in 1872 and 1873. However, in correspondence with libraries, it was determined that many titles, once on their shelves, had been discarded or lost.² The great fire of Baltimore in 1904, in which 2500 buildings were destroyed, would logically account for more of the missing books.

CHAPTER I

HISTORICAL BACKGROUND

Inscribed around the great seal of the State and Province of Maryland are the words "Scuto Bonae Voluntaris Tuae Coronasti Nos"-
"With the shield of Thy good will hast Thou covered us."

From the sailing of the Ark and the Dove on November 22, 1633, this affirmation has been justified by the realization of the
³ "hopeful colony" who sought a haven of religious freedom in the new world. Despite an often turbulent history, they prospered in the land to which they had come. They adhered to their high purpose that Catholics be unmolested in their beliefs and that toleration of other creeds be allowed.

⁴ George Calvert, first Lord Baltimore, had been a member of both the Virginia and the New England Companies. He was deeply interested in the settling of America by English people. In 1632, this Catholic gentleman received a grant of land from Charles I. Later to become Maryland, at that time the tract also included what is now Delaware. Before the signing of the charter, George Calvert died, being succeeded by his son Cecil.

In order to safeguard the interests of the settlement abroad, Cecil did not accompany the voyagers who numbered about 200, but delegated his brother Leonard to take his place. In 1634 the group landed at Port Comfort, Virginia, from whence they travelled to the mouth of the Potomac, where they laid out the City of St. Mary's

which was to become the capital until 1694. ⁵ "The first dealings of the Maryland colonists with the natives point to the removal of suspicion and the establishment of harmony, together with the conversion of some of the "naturals" to Christianity." Friendliness with the Indians seemed to assure the permanency of their venture.

In 1638 and 1639, through a compromise between freemen members of the Assembly and Lord Baltimore, a statute of governing laws was adopted. It seemed that harmony would reign, and this new foothold for the persecuted would endure. However, William Claiborne, a Virginian, who had established a trading post on Kent Island in Chesapeake Bay, refused to acknowledge the proprietary rights of Lord Baltimore. This became a subject of controversy between Maryland and Virginia until 1776. Also, the colony was distressed by a company of Puritans, who had been banished from Virginia for non-conformity. These enemies possessed St. Mary's from 1644 to 1646 when Governor Calvert regained it.

The Toleration Act of 1649 is perhaps the most famous of all laws enacted in Maryland. This guaranteed freedom of worship to all followers of Christ. Forshadowing the Constitution of the United States, this signal legislation expressed one of the fundamental beliefs of the American people.

Despite the advantages of the Toleration Act, it was not universally popular. The Puritans were so against it that the separate colonies of Anne Arundel and Charles were founded for them. When the Commonwealth was established in England, the Puritans revolted, defeating the forces of Governor Stone. They organized a governing commission under William Fuller, who remained in power

from 1654 to 1657.

⁶ During this time acts prejudicial to Catholics were passed. Lord Baltimore regained his rights in 1657, but in 1691, after the Protestant Revolution, Maryland was made a royal province. In 1692 the Anglican Church became the established religion and the Book of Common Prayer was mandatory for all public services.

This state of affairs lasted until 1715 when Benedict Leonard Calvert, a member of the Church of England, was given full political and proprietary rights. After his death, the fifth Lord Baltimore became heir to his responsibilities and privileges, which he retained until 1751. The last two lords proprietary were Frederick Calvert (1751-71) and Sir H. Harford (1771-76).

In 1694 Annapolis became the capital. Baltimore was not founded until 1730. In 1767, after fifty years of dispute, the Pennsylvania boundary line was determined by the surveying of the Mason and Dixon Line.

⁷ Maryland took an active part in the War of the Revolution, being one of the first colonies to protest the Stamp Act. After resigning its government to rule by popular convention in 1775, a Bill of Rights and a Constitution were adopted. The first republican legislature held a meeting at Annapolis in 1777. Becoming a member of the confederation in 1781, Maryland was honored by having Congress meet in its capital in 1783. In 1788 the Federal Constitution was accepted by the Maryland Convention, and Maryland became the seventh of the original thirteen states.

⁸ During the War of 1812, several British attacks were made on Maryland, particularly at Baltimore, Freetown, and Fort M'Henry.

At the bombardment of this last named encampment, Francis Scott Key wrote "The Star Spangled Banner."

The Civil War was a time of particular crisis for the Old Line State. Her sympathies divided, many of the citizens, favoring secession, became Confederate soldiers. Industrially, Maryland was a slave state, but her position called for allegiance to the Union. Fortunately, Union sentiment was paramount, and Washington was spared for the Federal government.

✓ The decade following the War between the States was a time of fierce political conflict and increasing material prosperity until the panic of 1873. ⁹ "Of all the crises of the past one hundred years, those of 1873 and 1929 are probably the most comparable, inasmuch as each followed a long war, a time of rapid economic progress, money and credit inflation, and unbridled optimism and speculation."

Printing in Maryland began in 1668 at the press of William Nuthead in St. Mary's City. This refugee from the edict against printing in Virginia is chiefly remembered for a manifesto drawn up in 1689 by Colonel John Coode and seven other leaders in defense of their actions after the Protestant Revolution. Addressed to the King and Queen, the work was titled "The Declaration of the Reasons and Motives for the Present Appearing in Arms of their Majesties Protestant Subjects in the Province of Maryland." It survives only in a London edition, crediting William Nuthead, at the City of St. Maries, as printer.

After the death of this pioneer in 1695, his widow Binah moved to Annapolis, the new capital, where she endeavored to support herself and two children by operation of her late husband's press.

10 Although illiterate to the extent of being unable to sign her name, she evidenced some knowledge of arranging type. But few specimens of the work from her establishment are now in existence. It is presumed that her printing activities came to an end in the same year as their initiation. No further records of her artistry are known to exist.

The next printer for the colony was William Bladen, a clerk of the House of Burgesses, who, with the aid of Thomas Reading, began operations in 1700. After publishing the first edition of the Maryland laws in 1700, he abandoned his new career at the end of the year. It was not a lucrative occupation.

Reading, a practical tradesman, carried on the work of public printing until his death in 1713. Arrangements were then made for the printing of government documents in Philadelphia at the press of Andrew Bradford. It was not until 1721 that the Maryland press was re-established by the eminent William Parks.

Although Peter Zenger, a protagonist in the fight for freedom of the press, is supposed to have lived near the village of Chestertown, no actual remnants of his work in Maryland have been discovered. Michael Piper attempted to fill the gap, by petitioning to be public printer. His efforts seem to have been in vain.

William Parks, an Englishman by birth, came to Maryland in 1726, where he was recognized as a person of considerable prestige. In 1727 this gentleman published A Compleat Collection of the Laws of Maryland. He is noted also for the founding of the Maryland Gazette in September 1727 at Annapolis. The high quality of this remarkable newspaper was due in part to the ambitious strivings of

Mr. Parks, who is said to have actually had foreign correspondents. Unfortunately, Parks left Maryland to become the official printer for Virginia.

About 1738, Jonas Greene came to take his place, being the only printer in Maryland for twenty-five years. This New Englander founded a dynasty which was to dominate the press for almost a hundred years. In 1745 he established the second Maryland Gazette which was to be published by members of his family until December 12, 1839.

After the death of Jonas Greene, his widow, Anne Catherine Greene, carried on her husband's business until 1775. From March 23, 1775, a son, Frederick, later assisted by his brother Samuel,¹² continued the press until 1811. A grandson, also named Jonas Greene, was in charge of the press and the publication of the Maryland Gazette until 1839.

The newer City of Baltimore had begun to attract many types of enterprise, including publishing.¹³ In 1765 Nicholas Hasselbach had brought the first press to what was then a village of approximately two hundred families. About 1769, this newcomer was lost at sea. His equipment was later sold by his widow to William Goddard, who arrived in the monumental city in 1773.

¹⁴
"This man not only stood among the very foremost of his day in the typographic excellence of his work, but also has a place in history as the real creator of the American postal system." His newspaper the Maryland Journal and Baltimore Advertiser, the first in Baltimore, began publication August 20, 1773. In 1774 Goddard relinquished his managership of the Baltimore venture to his able

sister Mary Katherine. For nine years thereafter he devoted himself to the postal system, after which he returned to the Maryland Journal. James Angell, a brother-in-law, purchased the paper in 1793, whereupon William Goddard returned to Rhode Island where he spent his remaining days.

The second newspaper in Baltimore was Dunlap's Maryland Gazette or, The Baltimore General Advertiser, which was published there for part of the year 1778, when the press was removed to Annapolis. After James Hayes had purchased it, the new proprietor began a newspaper there, the Maryland Gazette and Annapolis Advertiser. This was short-lived.

In May 1873, John Hayes reestablished the Maryland Gazette, which was in publication until the end of 1791. The first daily newspaper was the Palladium of Freedom, printed for the first time on August 2, 1787, by Maurice Murphy and Richard Bowen. However, the first successful daily paper was the Daily Repository of David Graham, begun on October 24, 1794. The company was subsequently owned by Leonard Yundt and William Patton, who began the publication of the Daily Intelligencer on October 28, 1793. This replaced the Daily Repository. The new paper was later titled the Federal Intelligencer, then the Federal Gazette and Baltimore Daily Advertiser, under which name it survived under the direction of its original owners until 1806. Afterward John Howes, William Gwynn, and others were its mentors.

The Baltimore Evening Post, the third newspaper in Baltimore in 1793, had been established the previous year by Philip Edwards. Under its new name the Baltimore Daily Advertiser, this paper merged

with the Maryland Gazette to become the Maryland Journal and Baltimore Advertiser, a daily, which lasted until July, 1799.

Among the outstanding printers in Maryland was Samuel Sauer, who arrived there in 1794 and began printing books in foreign languages. He is remembered chiefly for a pocket edition of the Bible for which he was responsible.

Other newspapers appeared sporadically. In March, 1795, Thomas Clayland and Thomas Dobbin began The Daily Telegraphe, which, after some changes in title, became the Telegraphe and Daily Advertiser. This paper had a span of thirteen years. Also in existence from 1797 were the Weekly Museum, and the American and Daily Advertiser. Although the first of these had but a few issues, the latter one was published under various owners until 1817.

An important magazine, Niles' Weekly Register, was begun in 1811, and continued for some years by its founder, Hezekiah Niles. After 1836, his son William Odgen Niles was its director. This periodical made a genuine contribution to American journalism.

In other parts of Maryland, presses were set up before the end of the eighteenth century. Frederick, Hagerstown, Easton, and Chestertown had sufficient importance for the introduction of printers ink. At Hagerstown, John Gruber published his famous Hagerstown Town and Country Almanac, which is still a household byword far beyond the borders of its home community.

The Sun, famous Baltimore paper, was founded in 1837 by Arunah Shepherdson Abell. In an initial statement, its policy was thus expressed, "The common good, without regard to sections, factions, or parties, and for this object we shall labor without

fear or partiality." The rotary press invention of Richard M. Hoe, was first purchased by The Sun. Also, it is credited with introducing the carrier system for delivery of newspapers.

Foremost among book publishers in Baltimore in 1872 and 1873 was John Murphy, whose imprint "John Murphy and Co." appears on the greatest number of title pages in the following series. A native of Omagh, Tyrone, Ireland, he was born in 1812, the son of Bernard and Mary (McCullough) Murphy. At the age of ten, the future stationer and book-seller was brought to New Castle, Delaware. After attending the New Castle Academy, he went to Philadelphia, at sixteen, to learn the printing trade.

After his apprenticeship, from which he rose to be superintendent of the firm, he went to Baltimore where he opened a printing and stationery house. In 1837, he added the publication of books.

Although dealing in general books to a substantial degree, the specialty of the Murphy firm was Catholic books. For the publication of the Definition of the Dogma of the Immaculate Conception, Murphy received a papal medal of merit in 1855. For his Acts and Decrees of the Second Plenary Council of Baltimore, he was named "typographer to the Apostolic See" in 1866. Secular publications included James McSherry's History of Maryland (1850), the new constitution of Maryland of 1851, 1864 and 1867, as well as the Maryland Code and Public General Laws. Magazines and foreign books were also part of the output of his thriving interests.

Living quietly through the Civil War, this man of high integrity paid off all his liabilities after its cessation. Many business men of the time took refuge in bankruptcy. After the death of the founder, the firm was operated by his son Frank K. Murphy, and

continued until 1943, when the Cardinal Gibbons titles became the property of P. J. Kennedy and Co. in New York.

Second in importance during 1872 and 1873 was the firm of Kelly, Piet and Company. In 1859 John B. Piet and M. J. Kelly, former partners in the John Murphy Company, joined P. J. Hedian in a new publishing venture, known as Kelly, Hedian and Piet, at 174 West Baltimore Street. The house was successful in establishing a large trade, and after several changes in title, finally came into the sole ownership of John B. Piet, who then conducted it under his own individual name.

For publishing Fourteen Months in the American Bastiles, by Francis Key Howard, ¹⁷ "Mr. Piet and Mr. Kelly were arrested during the late Civil War and imprisoned by the military authorities." Although dealing in a variety of books, Kelly, Piet and Co. are perhaps best remembered for the publication of school books. In 1868 and thereafter, they published a series of readers and spellers for the public schools of Baltimore. These texts, edited by Newell and Creery, were used in many counties in Maryland and elsewhere throughout the county.

¹⁹ Louis Charles Schneidereith, another of our publishers was a member of Schneidereith and Son, Printers. He was born in Baltimore in 1852. Upon reaching manhood, he joined the firm which had been established in 1849 by his father, Charles W. Schneidereith. Their specialty was books in the German language, and they were also noted for the high standard of their typography.

²⁰ P. Newton Kurtz, an esteemed member of the publishing fraternity who operated during 1872 and 1873, was born in Baltimore in 1822. Under his own name, he established his firm in 1845, in the city

of his birth. He was a graduate of Pennsylvania College, and was characterized by a deep, religious nature and uncompromising morality. For many years he served as Treasurer of the Second Lutheran Church of Baltimore.

James Lucas and Son also operated in Baltimore at this time as job printers. James was born in Baltimore in 1795, and died in 1856. The son, John Deaver Lucas, also a native Baltimorean, was born in 1831 and lived until 1893. Of English extraction, their forefather, Basil, had come to these shores in 1704. James, a shrewd business man, acquired a fortune through his astuteness in publishing.

The titles of the imprints encompass a tremendous variety of subjects. Most numerous are those of an ethical nature, although practical writings also have their place. A few biographies and poems lighten the general seriousness of the list. The far-seeing vision of the men of the past with whom one comes into vicarious contacts through those writings, makes the miracle and the dream of present day America more understandable.
