The entries in the check list which comprise the third chapter and the major part of the dissertation are listed according to the following order:

PREFACE

This check list of Baltimore imprints is a portion of a larger work, that of a survey begun by the American Imprints Inventory whose goal was an ultimate, complete national bibliography. The project started with the research of the W. P. A. Imprints Inventory employees, under the direction of Douglas C. McMurtrie. This dissertation attempts to present a fragmentary picture of that whole, a survey of printing in the State of Maryland for the year, 1860. The following bibliography of books, serials, periodicals, and newspapers was selected from the W. P. A. Imprint slips held at the Library of Congress. The National Union catalog and the Library of Congress catalog were consulted for further information. In addition, letters were sent to distant holding libraries in order to complete bibliographic data when such data was lacking on the slips.

A brief historical sketch of the social, political and economic conditions of the period under which the printing was done and an account of the principal printers of Maryland is presented in the first chapter. A bibliography of sources used for historical fact concludes the first section.

The second chapter presents an index to the holding libraries, compiled with the aid of a publication of the Library of Congress, entitled, Symbols Used in the National Union Catalog of the Library of Congress, eighth revised edition, 1960. A list of

private collections follows the key to the symbols.

The entries in the check list which comprise the third chapter and the major part of the dissertation are listed according to the Library of Congress and the American Library Association rules for author and title. The arrangement is alphabetical under author or under title when author is not known.

An alphabetical listing by place of the printers with the number of imprints of each makes up the fourth chapter. The fifth chapter presents a broad classification of the types and kinds of materials printed. The concluding chapter is comprised of an index, arranged alphabetically according to author, title, and subject heading.

Since the check list is that of a decade year, imprints whose dates are uncertain for a particular year between 1860 and 1870 have been included.

The writer would like to express her gratitude to everyone who helped in this production. A. HISTORY OF MARYLAND, 1860

The American Revolution had liberated the State of Maryland from the economic and social barriers inflicted by the exactions of a medieval landlord and freed the traders and merchants to sell and buy wherever they could find the most advantageous market. However, the basic economic problems had not been solved. The fertile Tidewater lands, which had helped the province prosper, had been overworked and the rich soil was being carried away by rain.¹ Moreover, despite the wheat-growing Piedmont area, the state was not producing enough food for its own use and the production of tobacco and wheat was not sufficient to pay for the amounts of food and manufactured articles imported from other states and from Europe. As the productivity of tobacco lands was beginning to lessen, slavery was becoming a burden and was beginning to have unfavorable social effects. Banking and currency were in need of public improvement and reform.

The rapid growth of population in the first part of the nineteenth century made necessary new sources of agricultural income as tobacco, Maryland's chief crop prior to 1800, was declining for the above stated reason. Many of the newcomers settled in the outlying regions of Maryland and cultivated wheat as the money

crop. Later they planted other grains and hay and began breeding cattle. The market for Maryland tobacco revived toward 1825 and in 1860, production reached 51,247 hogsheads.²

During the decade before the Civil War, farmers expanded their acreages of grain as quickly as new land could be cleared and planted. England repealed its corn laws in 1845 and food-stuffs entered the country free of duty.³ This enlarged the market for American breadstuffs, bringing about an expansion in wheat production in Maryland as elsewhere. Price increases boomed when the Crimean War shut off grain shipments from Russia through the Black Sea from 1853 to 1856.⁴

Maryland looked upon the evils of slavery and of the danger of increasing its population with members of another race early in its history. In 1783 the slave trade was prohibited by state law. It was a matter of economics, however, that reduced the slaves to twelve percent of the population by 1860. Long before the Civil War, many families had begun to free their slaves and by 1860 freed slaves formed thirteen percent of the total population of the state.

"Free" Negroes, however, were not entirely free. At times they were restrained from working at certain occupations, or from selling tobacco and other commodities without a certificate from a

justice of the peace. Again they were prohibited from keeping dogs, carrying firearms, attending religious services unless conducted by a licensed or ordained white minister, belonging to secret orders, or selling spirituous liquors. If convicted of any of these offenses, Negroes could be banished from the state.⁵

Baltimore's accessibility as an inland seaport enhanced its development as a market for trade with the West. At the turn of the nineteenth century, the volume of business had increased to such an extent that freight transportation by pack horses was supplanted by huge canvas-covered wagons. The lack of good roads was then the subject of wide criticism. The first improved roads in the state were the turnpikes constructed by incorporated road-building companies. The game and Indian trails formed the basic routes of many highways of Maryland.⁶

With the new roads bringing in the products from the West, boatbuilding boomed in Baltimore; merchants were soon making shipments in their own vessels and the town's prominence as a seaport was assured. Between 1810 and 1830, an active trade in American wheat and flour developed with Europe and the West Indies as a result of the interruption of normal agricultural pursuits in Europe by the war. The superior sailing qualities of Baltimore-built vessels had given them a world-wide reputation for speed and brought additional commerce to Baltimore.⁷

In the 1850's the Pennsylvania Railroad entered Maryland. Competing with the Baltimore and Ohio Railroad for control, it absorbed a number of smaller roads that were caught in the struggle between the giants.⁸

The Civil War brought a commercial and industrial decline, despite the fact that Maryland factories turned out large quantities of military supplies, and Maryland farmers, already profiting from the Crimean War, had formed a good market for their wheat and other foodstuffs. During the prosperous periods preceding the Civil War, a number of firms were founded which are still in existence today. Since 1856, a Baltimore firm has had a virtual monopoly on certain types of weather measure instruments and calculators. Its founder, Julien P. Friez, collaborated with Ottmar Mergenthaler in Baltimore in the invention of the linotype machine.⁹

In 1860, when the threat of war between the North and the South hung like a storm cloud over Baltimore, there were few visitors from overseas and no accounts of the city and its inhabitants written by foreigners at that time seem to have appeared. But Baltimore was host to a distinguished group of Orientals, the members of the Japanese Embassy which arrived in Washington to exchange ratified copies of the commercial treaty concluded in 1858 between the United States and Japan, following

upon the heels of Commodore Perry's visit.¹⁰

After the ratification ceremonies had been concluded in the capital, the Japanese Ambassador Extraordinary and the members of the suite came to Baltimore, their first stop in a tour of the United States. During their stay they were guests of the city and their reception was perhaps the most colorful and picturesque ever accorded to any foreign visitors in Baltimore up to that time.

Public curiosity with regard to the Orientals was immense, as few Baltimoreans had ever seen a Japanese at that time. In describing the event, Scharf wrote in his Chronicles of Baltimore that in anticipation of the visit, great preparations had been made by the City Council to make the Japanese stay of the most pleasant and interesting character.

At an early hour the streets were alive with people of every class, moving to and fro, some to take part in the pageant about to follow, others anxious to gain accessible points to view a spectacle hitherto unknown to any city or the country.¹¹

Scharf goes on to describe the arrival at Camden Station, where a scene of wild excitement ensued; men, women, and children, white and black, sent up loud hurrahs and screams and ran toward the train as if they might be anxious to throw themselves under the wheels of the cars. The mayor cordially greeted the official visitors and escorted them to the conveyances assigned to them.

The Mayor, his aides, and a distinguished committee of Baltimoreans took their places in the parade, escorted by units of the Maryland Militia and, Scharf said, by the Paid Fire Department (established in 1858 under the reform administration of the city to replace the lawless volunteers of the past)¹² which on this occasion "appeared in public procession for the first time since its organization, and seemed to be the most attractive feature in the whole procession." The cavalcade proceeded to the hall of the Maryland Institute, where a halt was made and a formal reception in honor of the strangers took place. After the reception, the guests were shown to their apartments in the Gilmore House. In the evening they were entertained with an exhibition of the Fire Department and a brilliant display of fireworks.¹³

The above described festive occasion, together with some of the conclusions gathered from work on the check list, give little indication that the people of Maryland were concerned with the oncoming threat of war. The imprints show that the three topics of interest which were published with the greatest frequency were religious, musical, or municipal in nature.

B. HISTORY OF PRINTING IN MARYLAND, 1860

The number of imprints in the check list sufficiently proves the activity of printers and publishers in Maryland in 1860. The following pages will discuss briefly some of the most important men in the field.

The publishing firm of John Murphy and Company contributed the greatest number of imprints to the check list. The founder of this company, John Murphy, was born in Ireland and came to America with his parents in 1822.¹ At the age of sixteen, he went to Philadelphia to learn and acquire the art of printing. Later he settled in Baltimore and established a printing and stationery house there in 1835. Baltimore, at the time, had fewer printing concerns and competition was less than in Philadelphia. The firm of Murphy and Company was primarily interested in Catholic publications, but it offered a diversity of titles. It is through the publication of translations of foreign Catholic authors by John Murphy that many such works were introduced into America.² He published and sold at a popular price many Bibles, hymnals, prayer-books, and devotional manuals.

The five-story building which housed the firm of John

Murphy and Company was located at 182 Baltimore Street. The structure contained a stationery and book store, featuring for sale not only the books published by Murphy, but those of other American publishers. A specialty of the store was its foreign publications imported from Europe. Above the retail establishment was located the printing presses, the type cabinets, and the bindery. It was the boast of John Murphy that he had established to practical advantage the combination of printing, binding, and selling under one roof.³

The firm of Kelly, Hedian & Piet is also well represented in this check list. M. J. Kelly and John B. Piet learned the printing trade from John Murphy and were partners in the latter's firm until 1858. At that time the two formed a partnership with P. J. Hedian and opened a printing establishment at 174 West Baltimore Street.⁴ A successful trade was established and after a series of changes, the firm's name was standardized with the title, Kelly, Piet & Company. Patterned after the house of John Murphy, Kelly, Piet & Company were book sellers as well as book publishers. Their book store contained the works of both American and foreign writers.⁵

Joseph Robinson, a native of Maryland, established a printing office in Baltimore. In addition to this, he was owner

of a circulating library, publisher of a weekly magazine, and a commissioned officer in the State Militia.⁶

Most of the printers of this period were stationers and book sellers. The retail industry constituted the bulk of their businesses, and they advertised themselves primarily in this field. Among those who fall into this category are T. Newton Kurtz, John P. Des Forges, and Cushing & Bailey.⁷

The Lucas Brothers owned and operated a foundry which furnished printing articles and machinery. Their reputation was known throughout the South and West for the latest technical developments in the printing trade. Their firm, which was located on Bank Lane, was divided into the following departments: machinery, casting, finishing, electrotyping, moulding, and composing.⁸

John Gruber came to Hagerstown, after beginning his printing career in Philadelphia, and started a German newspaper. Besides his publications in German, Gruber is best known for his Hagerstown Town and Country Almanac which was published in German until 1888, when an English edition was begun.⁹ This almanac illustrated farm activities by means of woodcuts and contained

information on the weather and crops. Although John Gruber was forced to retire in 1855, his printing firm continued to flourish.¹⁰

Most of the prominent Baltimore printers of this period learned their art in Philadelphia which was a printing capital. Through their own skill and ambition, they brought printing to Baltimore and many, i.e. John Murphy, J. Piet, and John Gruber, established a reputation as quality craftsmen as well as prosperous businessmen.
