MR. GOSLIN—Ways and Means.

A BILL

Entitled "An Act to appropriate a sum of money to erect in St. Annes Cemetery, in the city of Annapolis, a monument to the memory of Thomas G. Pratt, late Governor of Maryland, and also to place in the Executive Chamber, in said city, a portrait of the said Governor."

WHEREAS, The body of Thomas G. Pratt, late Governor of Maryland, now lies in St. Anne's cemetery, in the city of Annapolis, unmarked; and

Whereas, No portrait of the said Governor is now in the Executive Chamber, in the said city of Annapolis; and

Whereas, By reason of the great public service rendered by him during his term of office, 1844-7, in preserving the public credit, it is fitting that this State should accord to him its appreciation of a long delayed but merited tribute; now, therefore,

SECTION 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Board of Public Works be and they are hereby authorized to have erected

3 in St. Anne's cemetery, in the city of Annapolis, a suitable monument to the
4 memory of Thomas G. Pratt, late Governor of Maryland, and also to place
5 upon the walls of the Executive Chamber, in said city, a portrait to the
6 memory of the said Thomas G. Pratt, late Governor of Maryland, in appreci-
7 ation of eminent services to the State, and the sum of ten hundred dollars, or so
8 much thereof as may be necessary be and the same is hereby appropriated
9 to carry out the provisions of this Act; and the Comptroller of the Treasury
10 is hereby authorized to draw his warrant upon the treasurer for such sums
11 as the Board of Public Works, upon their requisition, may require.

SEC. 2. And be it enacted, That this Act shall take effect from the date of
1 its passage.
