

THE KENT LYNCHING.

Bad Feeling Growing Out of Two Recent Occurrences.

CHESTERTOWN, MD., May 22.—A meeting of colored men was held in Chestertown Friday, at which it was determined to "boycott" the white men who engaged in the recent lynching affair. The sheriff received a letter, dated Baltimore, May 19, in which it was stated that a mob was going to Chestertown and burn the town down for lynching Taylor. The letter states that no one will know what boat they are coming on. The letter is signed "Nigo Colord Mob," and is believed to be the idle vapping of some irresponsible person, for which the colored people in the city are not responsible.

At a conference of those in authority it has been decided not to hold an extra term of court to try the Hill murderers. It is thought an extra term would make more excitement than at a regular term and the expense would be little less.

The creamery business in Kent is still growing, and a new establishment at Millington has been commenced. The farmers have taken hold of the matter, and the merchants have also taken stock in the enterprise.

A bicycle club has been formed, with Mr. C. F. Star as captain. The club numbers about twenty, including several ladies. There is fully \$3,000 invested in the machines in Chestertown.
