Taik About "Homicidal Mania."

A Baltimore lawyer, who withholds his name, writes a long article to the Baltimore Sunday Herald in which he says the numerous contradictory statements made by Marshall E. Price, the murderer, have impressed him strongly with the belief that the condemned man has been suffering with "homicidal mania." or "transitory insanity," and thinks he ought to be granted a new trial. The writer makes copious extracts from medical journals to show that there are many cases of insanity with a "disposition to homicide," &c. He bases his argument on his unsupported statement that there was no motive for the murder.
