

STATE OF MARYLAND.

**The Remains of Marshall E. Price
Placed in the Grave.**

NO LYNCHERS DISCOVERED.

**The Investigation by the Cor-
oner's Inquest Fruitless.**

**The Fourth of July Celebrated All
Over Maryland—The New Fire De-
partment of Brunawick—Military and
Firemen's Parade and a Sham Battle
at Hagerstown—In Frederick.**

DENTON, MD., July 4.—The remains of Mar-
shall E. Price, who was lynched on Tuesday
night, were buried in the cemetery here at
12 o'clock today. The lot which had been
purchased by Mr. Joseph Price of Superin-
tendent Mowbray was not used, as several of
the directors of the Cemetery Association,
objected, and the grave was dug in the rear
portion of the cemetery ground, where per-
sons are buried who are unable to buy lots.

The father and wife of Marshal Price
came to town about 10 o'clock and began
final preparations for the burial. The jury
of inquest was in session and six of the
jurors went over to the jail with Undertaker
Cooper and took charge of the coffin and lot
and accompanied it to the cemetery, where
simple burial rites were read by Rev. Z. H.
Webster, who was Price's spiritual adviser.
Several persons went with the party who
had the coffin in charge. No relatives or
friends were present except the father and
wife.

The jury of inquest met, but no evidence
of importance was given, and it is thought
the investigation is practically over,
although no report has as yet been made.
The jury is to meet again, however. It is
thought they have been unable to obtain
any evidence which leads them to the dis-
covery of the parties who did the lynching.

Sheriff Berry is indignant over the criti-
cism of Millard F. Taylor, who claimed to
have notified the sheriff. A letter was re-
ceived by him to that effect, but was un-
signed and the sheriff could not locate the
author, and for that reason attached but
little importance to it. Since the burial of
the body talk over the matter has consider-
ably abated and the town will now resume
its wonted quiet.
