for the building of which Congress originally appropriated \$125,000 and for whose completion, including armament, \$300,000 will be available. She is intended for the exclusive use of the cadets, and will be one of the largest and by all odds the finest sailing practice ship in the world. She will be remarkable for her great sail-carrying power, the area of her principal sails being 13,191 square feet and her total sail area 19,975 square feet. She will also have the distinction of being the only single topsail ship afloat. Accommodations will be provided on the Chesapeake for the captain, ten ward-room officers, two warrant officers, 100 cadets and a crew of 90 men. In armament the vessel will be up-to-date, her battery consisting of six 4-inch rapid-fire breech loading rifles on the gun deck and four 6-pounders and two 1-pounder rapid fire guns on the spar deck. With boats she will be well supplied, having a thirty-foot steam cutter, 30-foot launch, two 28-foot cutters, one 28-foot whaleboat, one 22-foot whaleboat gig and one 20-foot dingy. Steam for the windlass, pumps, distilling apparatus, refrigerating plant, dynamos and for heating purposes will be supplied by two Scotch boilers of ample size. Her water tanks will have a capacity of 55 tons. There will be no steam propelling machinery, not even auxiliary. With three complete decks, built of the heaviest picked material, the Chesapeake will undoubtedly be a strong, seaworthy and durable vessel, splendidly fitted for the uses to which she will be put.

Wright Smith, colored, who was arrested in Baltimore and brought here as the suspected party who made the assault, was fully recognized by Mrs. Morrissey on Wednesday. He had a hearing in the afternoon and was committed for Court.

War Relics.

Mr. Louis Knackstedt, the well-known Maryland Avenue jeweler, has on exhibition in one of his show windows, a collection of valuable war relics sent him by a seaman of the U. S. S. Suwanee. Among the relics are a large lump of silver melted into a shapeless mass, weighing about 4 pounds; a lump of gold, weighing over 3 ounces; a large cavalry pistol; the shell of the first shot fired from the Suwanee; a Cuban machette; a gun gauge from one of the deserted guns of Morro Castle; a large dagger; three watches; a lot of Spanish silver pieces, badly burned; a number of Spanish cartridges with brass bullets; sleeve buttons; a thimble; a cuff button; a pair of machine-knife compasses; a bunch of keys and several other articles. They were taken from the wrecks of the Vizcaya, Quindo and Maria Teresa. They attract much attention from passers-by, and are considered very valuable relics by Mr. Knackstedt.
