SEND PROTEST ON LYNCHING

Negroes Appeal to Ritchie to Halt Maryland Mob Violence.

A telegram was sent to Governor Ritchie of Maryland yesterd by the National Association for the Avantoment of Colored People 69 Fifth Avenue, protesting against the lynching at Salisbury, Md., Friday night of a Negro taken from a hospital, and calling for action by the State to cope with mob uprisings.

After reviewing the circumstances of the lynching, the telegram said:

"In the same newspaper carrying an account of this latest lynching in your State is a dispatch quoting a speech of yours in which you appeal for full faith in American institutions and in the American idea of democracy. We appeal to you not only as Governor of Maryland, but as a leading exponent of the American system, to practice what you preach."
