Extracts from Regulations of the Board of Health to secure a full and correct record of Vital Statistics in the City of Baltimore.
 SECTION 2. And be it further enacted and ordained, That whenever any person shall die in the said city it shall be the duty of the Physician who attended during his or her last sickness, or the Coroner, when the case comes under his notice, to furnish within twenty-four hours after death, to the Undertaker, or other person superintending the burial, a certificate setting forth, as far as the same can be ascertained, the full name, sex, age, condition (whether married or single) of the person deceased, and the cause and date of death.
