Therefore it is considered by the Court here that the said Robert Allen free negro undergo a confinement in the Penitentiary houses in the City of Baltimore for the period of five years, according to the act of Assembly in such cases made and provided; and thereupon the said Robert Allen is committed to the custody of the Sheriff of Queen Anne County aforesaid to be by him as soon as possible safely removed at the expense of the county aforesaid to the Penitentiary aforesaid, therein to be kept &c.

The Court grant permission to William J. Hooper to retail articles of merchandises in Lemuel Furness house at Centerville in Queen Anne County, he having paid thereof to the Clerk of the County twelve dollars and twenty five cents and having stated that the amount of merchandises kept by him at the principal seasons of sale does not exceed one thousand dollars. Thereupon the said William J. Hooper as principal together with Arthur Emory Sr. and William H. Riley as securities acknowledged themselves to owe and be indebted to the State of Maryland in the sum of twenty pounds current money for the use of the said State in case the said William J. Hooper shall not well and truly observe perform and keep the several acts of Assembly relating to retailers of spirituous liquors and in every respect conform thereto

The Court grant permission to William H. Riley to retail articles of merchandises in Mrs. Kent's house at Centerville in Queen Anne County, he having paid thereof to the Clerk of the County twelve dollars and twenty five cents and having stated that the amount of merchandises kept by him at the principal seasons of sale does not exceed one thousand dollars. Thereupon the said William H. Riley as principal together with William J. Hooper and Arthur Emory Sr. as securities acknowledged themselves to owe and be indebted to the State of Maryland in the sum of twenty pounds current money for the use of the said State in case the said William H. Riley shall not well and truly observe perform and keep the several acts of Assembly relating to retailers of spirituous liquors and in every respect conform thereto

The Court grant permission to J. A. Elison & Brother to retail articles of merchandises in George W.
