of the offence charged - and the excite-
-ment which such an investigation oc-
-casions in this Community - were very
little favourable to a dispassionate
and impartial Verdict -

The Prisoner has always maintained
a good character - He was never held
in custody from the time the charge
was made - till his conviction, but
attended Court voluntarily -

With a full knowledge of the case
and of the character of Isaac -
I cheerfully unite in the petition
for his pardon -

I have had some opportunity of
knowing the sentiments of the
public here, on the subject - and
hazard nothing in saying that
the release of the Prisoner would
be regarded here as a just and
righteous exercise of Executive
clemency -
