Wm Campbell Shipper of the persons named and particularly described in the above manifest of slaves and *A Jones* Master of the *Barque* do solemnly, sincerely, and truly swear, each of us to the best of our knowledge and belief that the slaves named have not been imported in the United States since the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and eight; and that under the Laws of the State of Maryland, are held to service or labor as slaves and are not entitled to freedom under these laws, at a certain time and after a known period of service.—SO HELP US GOD.
