In the name of God Amen I John Hewitt of Queensbome
County Farmer being sick and weak of body but of sound
disposing Mind Memory & understanding and being desirous
to settle my worldly Affairs do make and publish this
my last Will and testament in Manner and form follow-
ing to wit. —

Item - I give and bequeath unto my wife Rebekah the use
Interest and Occupation of my Land and improvements where
on I now live until my son John arriveth to the age of ten
years on this express condition that it be a home for such of
my Children as may chuse to remain there as usual and to be
educated and clothed as well as the Interest or profits of the
said Land and improvements will admit of and at my son
John's arriving to the age of ten years the Land and
improvements afore mentioned to be the right and estate of
my son Thomas Hewitt his heirs and assigns for ever
reserving to my wife Rebekah her dower in said Land
during her natural life and if my son Thomas dies with-
out law full heirs begotten of his Body then the Land and
improvements afore mentioned to be the Right and estate of
my son John Hewitt his Heirs and assigns for ever —

Item — I give unto my son Thomas Hewitt all my Court satted
Pompey to be delivered to him at the time of Appraisment of
my estate — In witness whereof I have here unto set my
hand and affixed my seal this nineteenth day of April one
Thousand Eight hundred —

John Hewitt

other had him declare this to be his last Will and Testament
