and declare this to be my last will and Testament hereby revoking
all former wills by me made ratifying and confirming this.

Item. I will and desire that my Executors herein after named
sell and dispose of all my lands, or so much thereof as they
may think necessary for the payment of my debts or as to some if
possible my negroes for ~~the same~~ ^{the same} and.

It is further my will and desire that if an arrangement can
be made with my creditors that the whole of my property real
and personal together with that of my dear wife's be carried
on as it now is by her, my son James and my nephew William
and the proceeds thereof to be applied to the payment of my
debts.

Lastly I do hereby appoint my son James and my nephew
William executors of this my last will and Testament.
