William M. Hardcastle filed in Court here a Record, which is in the words and of the tenor following, to wit:

"State of Maryland Caroline County, Oct. October Term of the Circuit Court for Caroline County 1839. And now, on the eleventh day of October in the year Eighteen hundred and fifty nine, before the Honorable R. B. Carmichael, Judge of the Circuit Court for Caroline County, being one of the Circuit Judges in the seventh Judicial Circuit Composed after the Counties of Kent, Queen Anne's, Talbot and Caroline, came William M. Hardcastle, a man over Court made oath and say; that a certain negro man, named: "George Emory" who owed service and labour to the said William M. Hardcastle for life agreeably to the laws of Maryland, did run or about the Month of June in the year Eighteen hundred and fifty, escape and abscond from the service and labour of the said William M. Hardcastle and has not yet returned. And that the following is the description of said Negro man. He is about thirty two years of age and is about five feet eight or ten inches ~~highly~~ height. is a dark Phenial Colour, that is between a Chestnut and a black, having a small defect in one of his eyes. And now at the same time in the said Court appear William Hardcastle and Robert B. Culborth of the State aforesaid, also make oath and say, that they know the said negro man herein mentioned, and that the said negro man is a slave for life of the said William M. Hardcastle, and that the said negro man escaped from the service of the said William M. Hardcastle, as is sworn by said William M. Hardcastle, and has not yet returned; and that the description above given is an accurate description of the said negro man. Whereupon as satisfactory proof has been made as aforesaid before the said Court, that the said negro man owed labour and service to the said William M. Hardcastle agreeably to the laws of Maryland, and has escaped and absconded from the said service and has not yet returned. It is ordered by the said Court at the instance of the said William M. Hardcastle, that these proceedings, including the general description of the said negro man, herein before given be entered on the records of the Circuit Court for Caroline County agreeably to the provisions of the act of the thirty first Congress of the United States of America entitled "An act to amend and supplementary to the act, entitled "an act respecting fugitives from Justice, and persons escaping from the service of their masters, approved Feby twelfth, one thousand seven hundred and ninety three."
