W. Conigal, agreeably to the laws of Maryland and has escaped and absconded from the said service, and that these proceedings including the general description of the said negro Slave Jim, herein before given be entered on the record of the Circuit Court for Caroline County, agreeably to the provisions of the act of thirty first Congress of the United States of America, entitled "An act to Amend, and Supplementary to the act entitled an act respecting fugitives from Justice, and persons escaping from the service of their Masters." Approved February 12th one thousand seven hundred and ninety three.
