This Indenture made this fourth day of April in the year of our  
 Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty six between Henry  
 Hammond of the City of Annapolis and State of Maryland of the  
 one part and William McCreon of the City and State of Maryland of the other  
 part Witnesseth whereas the said Henry Hammond owes and stands  
 justly indebted to the said William McCreon in the sum of three  
 hundred dollars current money, by single bill bearing date the thirtieth  
 day of March eighteen hundred and thirty six with interest from the  
 date thereof and to secure the payment of the same the said Henry  
 Hammond is willing and hath agreed to execute these presents. Now  
 this Indenture Witnesseth that for and in consideration of the above  
 recited premises, and of the sum of five dollars current money to him  
 the said Henry Hammond well and truly paid by the said William  
 McCreon at or before the sealing and delivery of these presents the receipt  
 whereof is hereby acknowledged, the said Henry Hammond hath  
 given granted bargained sold conveyed and transferred and by  
 these presents doth grant bargain sell convey and transfer unto  
 the said William McCreon his Executors administrators and assigns  
 forever one negro boy named Wesley Anderson to serve until the eighth  
 day of August eighteen hundred and fifty one bedstead and  
 contains one clothes press, one red board, and all the glass upon it and  
 the China ware within it one yankie clock one Mahogany dining  
 table, two Mahogany card tables ten chairs one rocking chair one  
 old English carpet and ten yards Matting carpeting one home made  
 carpet one gilt looking glass one shaving looking glass, one pair  
 silver plated canals ticks one pair of brass candle snuffers and stands  
 one Mahogany washstand, one walnut knife & spoon case one oval  
 one pair flowered mantle stand five old pictures one pair of brass  
 mounted shoes and tongs wood pair brass andirons one pair of  
 one pair of shoes one pair of shoes one pair of shoes

wood saw and horse one wooden chest three hair bunks one small Mahogany  
 bureau four baskets one washstand one toilet table six tin warden one brass fender  
 two health rugs two pair of pillows one pair flat irons one pair Green cloth table  
 Covers one pair window curtains one pair window blinds one flax carpet, one  
 frying pan and one pot and two pine tables all which property is  
 now in the possession of the said Henry Hammond to have and to hold  
 the said property above mentioned unto the said William McCreon his  
 Executors administrators and assigns, forever to his and their only pro-  
 use and behoof and to and for no other use intent or purpose what so ever  
 Provided always and it is the true intent and meaning of these presents  
 that if the said Henry Hammond his Executors or administrators do and  
 shall well and truly pay to the said William McCreon his Executors  
 administrators or assigns the aforesaid sum of three hundred dollars  
 with interest as aforesaid, whenever the same shall be demanded then  
 these presents and every matter and thing herein contained shall cease  
 and be utterly null and void any thing herein contained to the  
 contrary thereof notwithstanding. In Witness whereof the said
