This Indenture made this twenty second day of July in the year of our Lord eighteen hundred and thirty nine between William McMer of the state of Maryland Anne Arundel County of the one part and Mary Dryden Hall of the state and county aforesaid of the other part Wherea the said William McMer owes and stands or justly indebted to the said Mary Dryden Hall in the sum of one thousand dollars current money now due and owing to the high tenth day of May eighteen hundred and thirty nine and to secure the payment thereof willing to execute these presents Now this Indenture witnesseth that the said William McMer for and in Consideration of the premises and of the sum of four dollar current money to him in hand paid by the said Mary Dryden Hall at and before the sealing and delivery of these presents, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged hath granted bargained and sold and by these presents doth grant bargain and sell unto the said Mary Dryden Hall her executors administrators and assigns the following negroes Slaves for her and her children named Jane and her four Children Conveyed by Bill of Sale from the said Mary Dryden Hall to the said William McMer on the Tenth day of July eighteen hundred and thirty nine To have and to hold the said negroes Slaves unto the said Mary Dryden Hall her executors administrators and assigns to her and

their own use and behoof. Provided always and be it the true intent and
(meaning) of these presents that if the said William McMer do and shall
well and truly pay or cause to be paid unto the said Mary Dryden Hall her
executors administrators or assigns the full sum of four thousand dollars
lawful money with legal interest for the same which interest is to be paid
annually on or before the right next days of May in the year eighteen
hundred and forty two then and in such case these presents and every
matter and thing herein contained shall cease determine and be
utterly void to all intents and purposes anything herein contained
to the contrary notwithstanding In Testimony whereof I have hereunto
