in the year Eighteen hundred and fifty a Bill of
Sale, was brought to be recorded which is in the
following words to wit: Know all Men by these
presents, That I, John H. Tilden, of Kent County and State of Maryland, for
and in consideration of the sum of one hundred and ninety dollars lawful
money of the United States, in hand paid by Joseph T. Mitchell, of Kent County
and State of Maryland, at or before the sealing and delivery of these presents,
the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged Have granted, bargained and sold,
and by these presents Do grant bargain and sell, unto the said Joseph T. Mitchell
his Executors, Administrators, and Assigns, one negro boy named Tom, two
horses and two heads of cattle, To Have and To Hold the said described property

to the said Joseph T. Mitchell his executors, administrators, and assigns forever; and I the said John H. Tilden unto the said Joseph T. Mitchell, his executors, administrators and assigns, against me the said John H. Tilden my executors and administrators and against all and every other person or persons whatsoever, shall and will Warrant and forever defend by these presents. Provided if the said John H. Tilden shall pay to the said Joseph T. Mitchell the said sum of Money and interest, then these presents to be Void. In Witness whereof I have herewith set my hand and seal this 27th day of November eighteen hundred and forty nine,
