Be it remembered that on this Twelfth day of March in the year
Eighteen hundred and fifty a Bill of Sale was brought to be
recorded which is in the following words to wit. Know all
men by these presents, That I Joseph T. Mitchell, of Kent County and
State of Maryland, for and in consideration of the sum of Two hundred dollars lawful
money of the United States, in hand paid by Richard Smyth, of Kent County and State of
Maryland, at or before the sealing and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof
is hereby acknowledged: Have granted, bargained and sold, and by these presents do
grant bargain and sell, unto the said Richard Smyth, his Executors, Administrators,
and Assigns, my negro girl named Fanny aged fourteen or fifteen years and a
Slave for life. - Now living with Mrs Lyger, To Have and to Hold the said
described negro girl Fanny, to the said Richard Smyth, his executors, administra-
-tors, and assigns forever; and I the said Joseph T. Mitchell, unto the said
Richard Smyth, his executors, administrators and assigns, against me the said Joseph
T. Mitchell, My executors and administrators, and against all and every other
person or persons whatsoever, shall and will warrant and forever defend by these
presents, the said negro girl Fanny, In witness whereof I have hereunto set my
hand and seal this Twelfth day of March, eighteen hundred and fifty,
