The undersigned make the following alteration in the value of the negroes belonging to the estate of Araminta Frazier deceased, in consequence of negro Henry, who was allotted to John Frazier, being a cripple, which was not considered at the time the preceding appraisement & distribution was made

In the annexed appraisement, the whole valuation of the negroes was $\$1791$ -
