 sheweth that your Petitioner is the daughter of Rachel who was
 the daughter of an Indian woman named Alice or Mary, that
 the said Mary was a Free Native of America who lived and
 died in love, that your Petitioner has been entitled to Freedom
 from her birth, that she is now deprived thereof & held as a
 Slave by William Wilkins of the Town of Baltimore, your
 Petitioner therefore prays process against the said Wilkins to answer
 the Promises & she otherwise redressed on may soon right
