An Act for the Repeal of the Act for Customs

This Assembly considering the Clashing between the Laws made at the Assembly held the Second day of January 1656 at St Annagoes Forte wherein in Consideration of the Customs in that Act Granted to his Lordship the Right Honourable the Lord Proprietary he doth undertake the whole Charge of the Government both in Warre and in Peace and that other Act confirmed by his Lordships Declaration bearing date the 6th day of August 1650 Entituled an Act concerning Levying of Warre within this Province in the Last Clause of which Act the whole Charge of any warre arising within this Province is to Be Levied Upon the Province by an Equal Assesment upon the Persons and Estates of the Inhabitants thereof any thing in that Act or any other Act to the contrary thereof notwithstanding, and further Taking into serious Consideration the Burthen of that Act and the vast Charge that hath been drawn upon the Province by the late treacherous Revolt of Josias Vendall and his Complices and the Great Expence they must be at to defend the Province against the Inursions of the Iredoon Indians that of Late have murdered some of the Inhabitants thereof the which Charge by Act of this Present Assembly they have undertaken, do Pray that by the Authority of the Lord Proprietary with the Assent of the Upper and Lower House of this General Assembly the said Act made at an Assembly held the Second Day of January 1656 at St Annagoes Fort and Entituled an Act for Customs may be repealed and Be it Enacted by the Authority & Consent aforesaid that the said Act for Customs is hereby utterly repealed forever
